Update CARP lawsuit Hearing date rescheduled United Techs vs the IBT

ALTA fighting for our Profession and the rights of United Technicians.

As some of you may know, our fellow technician Plaintiff Harry Beier involved in the CARP Pension and Profit Sharing lawsuit has had a major medical event recently.

As a result, the UAL technicians and Legal counsel involved in the case have requested a rescheduling for 60-days to evaluate how this will impact the case going forward.

For now, the hearing has been moved to July and our responses to the motions to dismiss are due on June 17th.

In 2005, United Technicians negotiated the right to a Pension.

LOA 05-03M was negotiated to provide a pension to every United Technician if United Airlines “maintained” an existing pension plan. United technicians were the *only* union group to negotiate this specific language.

- **On October 31, 2018 United technicians, filed a complaint in the U.S. District Court in San Francisco** to address these claims.
- **On February 8, 2019 United technicians amended their complaint.**
